- Abstract of maximum 350 words, engaging with the conference theme “*Saving energy in buildings: why does context matter?*” Include references where necessary/appropriate.
- Note oral or poster presentation preference.

All abstracts will be peer reviewed by a UCL and Loughborough university panel of research students and published electronically and/or in the conference pack.
